EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

MINIMUM MEASURE 1: Public Education and Outreach in Stormwater

Impacts: The Village has met it's first year Measurable Goals in this category by disseminating educational materials, setting up display areas, and communicating about Stormwater pollution directly with the public. In the coming year it will enhance the educational material available on it's website and review the Annual Report with the public as required. It will also make available to community groups and organizations speakers on Stormwater pollution control measures.

MINIMUM MEASURE 2: Public Involvement/Participation: As required Mr. James Cole, Superintendent of Public Works, has been designated as the responsible party for maintaining public access to Stormwater Plan implementation records and information. The Stormwater Plan has been presented at a public meeting of the Village Board of Trustees and the public has been invited to comment.

MINIMUM MEASURE 3: Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination: The required Outfall map showing points of discharge of Stormwater to waters of the US has been prepared. Chapter 269 of the Village Code specifically prohibits the discharge of polluted waters to the storm drain system.

MINIMUM MEASURE 4: Construction Site Stormwater Runoff: A Committee made up of elected and appointed staff members has been designated by the Village Board to begin a thorough review of the Village Code for amendments to implement Stormwater BMP's. The Committee will make recommendations for legislative actions to the Village Board during Year 2.

MINIMUM MEASURE 5: Post-Construction Stormwater Management: A Committee of key appointed officials has been designated by the Village Board to review the Village Code and other land use regulations for implementation of the Stormwater BMP's and adoption of the NYS Design Manual.

MINIMUM MEASURE 6: Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping: A housekeeping manual is being drafted for use by Village employees to minimize polluted runoff from Village operations including vehicle washing and repair, lawn care and fertilization, hazardous waste storage and disposal, etc.
